



## **Specialist Anaesthetist**

### **Short Stay Surgical Unit, Greenlane Clinical Centre**

We are looking for Specialist Anaesthetists with an interest in Ambulatory Anaesthesia. Full-time positions are available and preference will be given to those interested in positions greater than 0.5 FTE. A joint appointment with sessions in other Departments of Anaesthesia in ADHB may be possible.

The Short Stay Surgical Unit (SSSU) has five operating theatres at the Greenlane Clinical Centre, an ambulatory facility at Greenlane for outpatient clinics and elective surgery. With a recent expansion and refurbishment there now is the provision for eight operating rooms, with overnight beds opening soon. Current services at SSSU include Oral Health, Ophthalmology (both with paediatric and adult patients), Gynaecology, General Surgery, Urology (including lithotripsy) and Otorhinolaryngology (ORL) and these will be extended. In addition, there will be more paediatric services (General Surgery, ORL and Orthopaedics) and a wider range of adult services.

ADHB is a tertiary referral centre with the other four Divisions of Anaesthesia at the Grafton site covering all major specialities and sub-specialities. These include cardio-thoracic, vascular, obstetric, trauma, hepatic, transplant and neuro- surgery at Auckland City Hospital and paediatric surgery at Starship Hospital.

You must be vocationally registered or eligible for vocational registration with the Medical Council of New Zealand.
