

Enhancing Recovery After Surgery

Faculty:

- Invited speaker Assoc Prof Jonas Nygren is a colorectal surgeon in Stockholm. He implemented one of the first ERAS programmes in the late 1990s, and is one of the original members of the European ERAS Study Group. He has extensive experience in ERAS implementation, development and research.
- Mr Mattias Soop is a surgeon & senior lecturer at North Shore Hospital, originally from Stockholm, who has been working in ERAS research in Scandinavia & Europe for over 10 years.
- Assoc Prof Andrew Hill is a surgeon at Middlemore Hospital who established Australasia's first ERAS programme. Within this programme, he performs ongoing research on novel perioperative interventions.

Perioperative care and surgical technique is developing rapidly. Enhanced-recovery protocols seek to optimise and streamline key aspects of surgical care. In elective abdominal surgery, such protocols have been shown to significantly reduce the risk of complications and improve postoperative recovery.

Topics include:

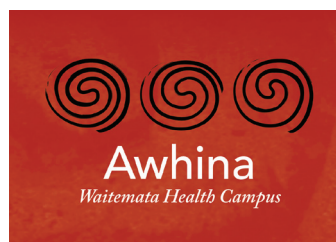
- Optimal preparation of the surgical patient
- Optimal anaesthesia and fluid therapy
- Optimal surgical techniques
- Optimal nutrition
- Optimal ward care and mobilisation
- Implementation and other practical aspects
